



From the Provincial's Desk

Dear Confreres,

With profound joy, I greet you on the Feast of our Founder, Fr. Peter Marie Mermier, a genuine apostle and disciple of St. Francis de Sales. On his death anniversary, we commemorate the completion of the work of the mission which had been reserved for Fr. Mermier. Besides his zeal for the mission, he desired greatly to live in community. He wished that all the members lived together with unwavering love and zeal. For him, living with the Brothers in the community and zeal for the souls are inseparably related to each other. St Paul underlines the need for mutual help in staying faithful to the Lord: "Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing" (1 Thess 5:11). Canonical Visitation to Malawi Mission

The Impressions gained from my Canonical Visit to Malawi



In October 2023, we will be completing five years of missionary journey in Malawi, a landlocked country in Southeastern Africa. Within this short span of time, we have made a remarkable impression in this region by the grace of God. Out of the 19 million people of Malawi, about 80% are Christians. Catholics are about 35% of the total population. The participation of the faithful at the liturgy and their cooperation in the administration of the parish are praiseworthy. 80% of the local people fall below poverty line.

Over 60% live on a less than a dollar per day, and earn their living through subsistence farming. They work during the rainy season and are jobless at other times. In the months of January, February, and March, they experience acute food shortages. Most of them live in huts. In spite

of poverty, people are generous towards the growth of the Church. They contribute their energy and time. They bake bricks for the construction of common projects; they support the priests with special collections; the faithful bring rice, grocery and at times chicken as offertory, they are ready to do the household works at the Church, in the Parish offices and in the presbytery, whenever required. There is scarcity of fuel for vehicles these days. We see long queues at the filling stations. There is also a fear of devaluation of Kowcha, the local currency. Amidst the challenging situations, our confrères are carrying out their pastoral and developmental works very efficiently.

The local clergy appreciate us for our method of pastoral ministry, especially for visiting the families, insisting upon praying rosary regularly and for sharing their food with them. The faithful experience a positive change in their lives after the visit of the priests their homes and praying for them. Another area for appreciation for our ministry is our focus on developing the substations. Our Confrères constantly visit the outstations and substations and give due importance to their pastoral needs, too. Our Fathers also learn from the local clergy to pray the breviary more earnestly. Some of our communities cultivate maze or paddy and use the returns for the



maintenance of the community. They are taking efforts to support the community with activities connected to agriculture.

Our Fathers in the mission are making positive strides in the process of mastering the local language. In the dioceses of Karonga and Mzuzu, the local language is Tumbuka, and in Lilongwe, and in the rest of the country, it is Chichewa, which is also the national language. The bishops are more than happy with the contribution of the Fransalian missionaries in Malawi and are inviting more priests to work as missionaries, and to make richer contribution.



In General, there is a great expectation on us from the Bishops. Their assessment is that education can bring a lot of changes in the next generation, in both faith and social life. Therefore, the bishops request us to build primary school in three of our parishes.

Construction and Renovation of the Priests' Houses

Livingstonia: Fr. Anandaraj and Fr. Infant are living in a temporary house without much facility. This house was built by the parishioners for the catechist and was renovated in 2019. The house is very small and equipped with minimum facilities for the daily use.

Ngerenge and Kameme: These two parishes have well-furnished rectories, which is a result of the joint venture by the diocese and our province.



Edingeni: They, too, are living in a temporary house, which was formerly the parish office, and so not self-contained. There is neither water supply nor electricity. The fathers have to fetch water from neighboring public hand borehole for daily use with the help of the workers, Portable solar bulbs are used for light. Fathers have to go to the church and charge electronic gadgets. With the help of the bishop, the project for the construction of a new presbytery is sanctioned and the work will begin soon.

Manyani: On 30th July, a new presbytery (temporary house) was inaugurated in Manyani. The

house has not yet received the electricity and water connection. Water is to be fetched from the nearby well and stored in the house. The parishioners render their assistance for such works. In the future, when a presbytery is built, the present house will be used as the house of the catechist.



Future Projects

- (i) The Bishop of Mzuzu has promised to entrust to us an established town parish at Mzuzu next year. Mzuzu is strategically located in the middle of the country and so it would serve us as a transit place too.
- (ii) We have purchased a land at Lufita (Karonga Diocese) in 2022. The registration is not yet complete, as the procedure is slow and complicated. The intention is to build a secondary school there.
- (iii) The Archbishop of Lilongwe (the capital city) requests us to start an Institute for On-Going Formation for the Clergy and Religious, and a secondary school which could financially support this institute. This proposal is to be studied further.
- (iv) All the parishes own good pieces of land, which could be utilized for our purpose as long as we are serving the parish.

Dear Conferes, I had a fruitful visit to Malawi. It was an opportunity to meet our conferes engaged in this historical and frontier mission of the Province, come in contact with them more closely and to know the mission personally, to meet all the bishops of the dioceses where we are working, to know their appreciation for us as well as their expectations upon us. I could also meet the new auxiliary bishop of Mzuzu, who was a student of Lumen Christi, our institute in Arusha, Tanzania. I thank very sincerely Fr. Susairaj, the Mission Superior who planned out my programs systematically and accompanied me during most part of my travel. I too express my gratitude to Fr. Anantharaj, the Mission Procurator who arranged all that was the needful for my visit and all the Superiors and other Fathers who made sure that I had a comfortable stay and safe travel. They ensured that I felt at home with them, even sacrificing their own comfort. I thank all of them for their love towards our mission, for their commitment and dedication in the responsibility entrusted to them. Due their hard work and passion for mission, the bishops appreciate us profusely and welcome us to take up more responsibilities in the mission. The presence of the Fransalians is making big waves in Malawi.
