Friendly Home offers good education and accommodation in a family atmosphere to the poor children, who are mostly orphans or Semi-orphans. There are two units. This academic year we have 37 school children, 14 college children and 12 staff. We always keep up-to-date all the Government certificates, also for the year 2024 - 2025.

Second Sunday is the visitor's day and parent's meeting day. We also arrange social and cultural programmes every Sunday to animate the children with the motivating Programs like counselling, hygiene, ECA, Medical camp, spiritual, social and awareness programmes. A few programs are combined with the children of Friendly Home – unit II. Children are excelling in studies, games and other activities. Some children are the first generation in the field of education. A few girls and a few boys are given special classes for improving in reading, writing and speaking in English. Every year many of our children take part in Zonal games, sports and athletics. CWC and DCPO appreciated our children for winning prizes.

- Spoken English: To improve our students' English language skills, we have introduced Spoken English classes for this academic year, which helps them to communicate effectively and confidently.

- Shopping Complex: One of the major plans for the school is to build a shopping complex within the school premise which would potentially become a permanent source of income. Efforts are being taken towards this purpose.
